

Integrated Land Management Plans

- Available to all farmers/crofters with a BRN
- Replace Whole Farm Reviews
- Greater focus on public good
- Programme delivers 300 per annum
- Funding £1,200 per plan- farmer to pay any costs above this threshold and the full vat





Specialist Advice

- ILMP will signpost to specialist advice for more indepth support
- Each farmer is eligible for 2 specialist advice visits
- Programme will deliver 100 specialist advice visits per annum
- Variable intervention rate up to £1,000 funding for public good advice and £500 for business efficiency advice
- Farmer to pay any costs above this threshold and the full vat



- £500 Improves business efficiency & effectiveness
- £1,000- Delivers public benefit, areas such as:
 - Climate change and adaptation
 - Biodiversity, habitat and landscape management
 - Woodland management and conservation
 - Water pollutions prevention and control
 - Archaeological and historical site advice
 - Soil management and nutrient management
 - Organics



Carbon Audits

- Measure of resource efficiency and benchmarks against similar enterprises
- Utilising SAC's Agricultural Resource Efficiency Calculator (AgRE Calc).
- 250 carbon audits annually.
- £500 per audit farmer to pay costs above this full vat
- Encouraged to update annually





Mentoring for new entrants to farming Why mentoring?

- Peer-to-peer relationship
- So new entrants can access to the valuable skills and
 - knowledge of an experienced peer.
- Matched to the business's needs
- A mentor can guide a new entrant through the set-up & early years.





Mentees

- Must be a new entrant to farming (farmers or crofters who have been head of an agricultural business for up to five years
- Programme to support 60 mentees per year
- Mentees up to 4 days support between 2016-2020



Mentors

- Experienced farmers with skills or knowledge matched to the mentee
- Mentors paid an honorarium- £250 per day
- No mentor to exceed £2K per annum (ie 4 days mentoring per annum)
- Per mentor max of 2 mentees



Typical skills that mentors offer include:

- Detailed knowledge and experience of agriculture and running farm businesses
- A mastery of traditional skills such as stone walling, hedge laying etc.
- Land based educational and skills background
- Food and drink industry experience
- Finance and business planning now-how
- Surveying and planning skills

If you are considering becoming a farmer or crofter, or have set up business in the last five years, then you are entitled to free support through the Farm Advisory Service's mentoring programme.

Setting up any business is challenging, farming and crofting is no different. Because the success of new entrants to the farming industry is critical to the industry's overall long term sustainability, the Scottish Government is funding the Farms Advisory Service's mentoring programme.

As a new entrant, the programme gives you access to the valuable skills and knowledge of an experienced mentor, matched to your business's needs, who can guide you through the vital set-up and early growth-years of your business.

Typical skills that mentors offer you include:

- · Detailed knowledge and experience of agriculture and running farm businesses
- · A mastery of traditional skills such as stone walling, hedge laying etc.
- · Land based educational and skills background
- · Food and drink industry experience
- · Finance and business planning now-how
- · Surveying and planning skills

Who can apply?

Mentoring is available to all successful applicants to Young Farmers and New Entrants Start-Up Grant Schemes, There are two schemes available:

- . The Young Farmers Start-Up Grant Scheme is aimed at those who are starting an agricultural business for the first time or who are taking over an existing agricultural business.
- . The New Entrant Start-Up Grant Scheme is aimed at those who started their agricultural business in the last 12 months.
