EFA agro-forestry

- Is the land you have used to support EFA agro-forestry been:
- Basic Payment Scheme eligible arable land in 2015?
- Planted under a Forestry Grand Scheme since 2015?
- Have you prepared an EFA map, detailing the location and size of your EFA agro-forestry?
- Have you ensured that the area is subject to an agreement with the Forestry Commission under agro-forestry and been planted since 1st January 2015?
