Preferred WBC Structure & Location



Species	Preferred WBC Structure & Location
Grey Partridge	Thick canopy such as kale in open locations
Skylark	Open canopy such as sparse cereal away from boundary features
House Sparrow	Close to farm buildings
Tree Sparrow	Next to thick hedges, small woodlands or scattered trees
Bullfinch	Next to tall hedges or woodland
Linnet	Next to hedges or areas of scrub
Yellowhammer	Next to hedges
Reed Bunting	Next to hedges, close to ditches
