Breeding Stock



- Private Sales
 - No commission
 - Agree price directly
 - May avoid haulage costs
 - Biosecurity





Breeding Stock



- Market (Auction)
 - Get stock to the *right sale*
 - Take stock dressed appropriately
 - Research how your breed is usually 'dressed', i.e. trimming, colouring etc

- Put together even 'pen' of a decent number
- Consider a notice at your pen with details of treatments/vaccinations (or hand to auctioneer).






Dressing Sheep



 Some breeds expected to be heavily 'dressed' (e.g. Beltex), others should be shown untrimmed/undressed (e.g. Lleyn, Texel).










Dressing Sheep

- Clipping heads
- Clipping topline/tail
- Washing
- Drying/soap







Fatstock




- Finished animals/fatstock
 - Marketing groups/co-ops member only
 - Galloway Lamb Group/Farmstock Ltd
 - Direct to abbatoirs
 - Under contract need to book in
 - 'Fat ring' at market
 - Easy take all types of stock





Fatstock - Cattle







Beef – UK Classification



- Age
 - Cow beef less tender slow cooking/mince – can be sought after
 - <12 months classed as veal</p>
- Sex of animal
 - Bull beef less sought after
- Conformation
- Fat cover



Experienced grader can tell all this from just looking at the carcase



Typical Meat Yield



- Meat 42%
- Waste 42%
- Trimming 5%
- Skin/hide 11%


 Better shaped/appropriately fat animals will have greater saleable meat yield.

Grading Stock




- Fat 1, **2, 3L**, **3H,** 4L, 4H
- Conformation
 - -E: Excellent
 - U: Very Good
 - -R: Good
 - -O: Fair
 - -P: Poor






Grading Sheep









Presenting Stock



- Clean and dry
- Belly clip where necessary
 - Markets will often arrange this sheep
- Gut fill can account for 2 3 kg
- A wet lamb can account for 1 kg





Liveweight/deadweight



- Liveweight sales pay for animal on the hoof.
 - Mart weights can be contentious.
 - Buyers assess the likely yield and value of the meat on the animal.
- Deadweight sales
 - Animals are paid according to their yield of meat and a grading chart (weighted to encourage stock for particular market).





Deadweight



- Communication and booking in vital.
- Check what deductions will be made some suppliers different.
- Make sure that the your purchaser 'wants' your cattle or sheep – what is their market and is that what you're sending?
